SCHOOL REVIEW

Faith Education Meeting – First Eucharist

Dear Parents & Carers

The Sacrament of Eucharist or commonly known as First Holy Communion, faith education meeting will be held on Thursday 20th April 2017 in St. Patrick's School Stadium. Two sessions are being offered with the first commencing at 5pm and the second session at 6.30pm. You will only need to attend one. This faith formation evening is for those parents wishing their child to receive their First Holy Communion. Children need to be in Year 4 or above and need to have celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please contact the school to inform us what session you will be attending.

Parent / Carer and the child are expected to attend the evening. Due to numbers, we encourage one parent/carer to attend the evening with their child. The structure of the gathering will include a prayer and parents working together in a Workshop format. An outline of the ceremony, booking on line, and questions you may have will be discussed during the evening.

Dates that you may need to consider

First Holy Communion will be celebrated by Father Grant O'Neill on Saturday 3rd June and 10th June at 6.30pm in St. Patrick's Church, Kilmore. Sunday 4th June at 8.00am, 10.30am in St. Patrick's Church, Kilmore and at 9.15am at Our Lady Help of Christians, Broadford Church. Sunday 11th June at 8am, 10.30am and 3pm in St. Patrick's Church and 9.15am at Our Lady of the Way, Wallan Church.

Catechist Classes – Kilmore: will be conducted in the Parish Centre for those who wish to come to Kilmore. Classes will begin at 4.00pm – 5.00pm. There will be 5 sessions. **Tuesday 2nd, 9th, 16th, 23rd and 30th May.** Children will need to bring their pencil case and a drink.

Catechist Classes – Wallan: will be held at Our Lady of the Way Church in Bentinck Street, Wallan starting at 4.00 - 5.00pm. There will be 6 sessions. **Thursday 27th April, 4th, 11th, 18th and 25th May and 1st June.** The children will need to bring their pencil case and a drink.

Commitment Masses: will be Saturday 27th May at 6.30pm in Kilmore, Sunday 28th May at 8.00am and 10.30am Kilmore and 9.15am Wallan.

The cost of \$45.00 for all the requirements of the Sacrament will need to be paid on the evening or by the first lesson.

Dental Care for Children

Public dental care is available at Sunbury Community Health



All children, 0-12 years of age, can access our Dental Service for check-ups and general dental treatment.

There is no wait list for children and eligible young people 0-17 years of age.

Dental treatment can include sealants (to prevent dental decay), fluoride applications, x-rays, fillings and extractions.

Once your child registers with our Dental Service, we will send an offer for a check-up every year or two years.

What is the cost?

- This service is free for children of parents with a pension or health care card.
- Non-cardholders will pay \$32 for a course of care, which includes all general dental treatment. The cost per family will not be more than \$126.
- If you are eligible for the Child Dental Benefit Schedule, all treatment is bulk-billed to the maximum of \$1000 over two years. This is available for children (2-17 years of age) who qualify for Family Tax Benefit A. To check your eligibility please contact Medicare on 132 150 or Sunbury Community Health.

Our Dental Service operates 8.30 am – 4 pm, Monday to Friday.
